Hello Friends.

I am honored to introduce myself as the new Executive Director of AdoptAClassroom.org. I joined the organization in the spring of 2016 and it has been an exciting nine months, rich in experience and heartfelt moments.

I'm proud to announce that during the 2015-2016 school year we raised more than \$2 million for teachers. This means that we funded nearly 10,000 teachers which benefited more than 245,000 students. We could not have accomplished this without you. Thank you.

This past back-to-school season I had the opportunity to witness one of our larger school adoption events at a K-12 charter school in the south side of Los Angeles. During the event our corporate sponsor surprised each of the school's 82 teachers with a \$600 gift card to AdoptAClassroom.org. I will never forget the tears of joy and appreciation expressed by the teachers. It was a combination of gratitude and the relief knowing they had funds to better equip their classrooms and give their 1700 students a greater shot at success. But this is one school, in one community.

There are teachers and schools across the country that continue to need our help. On average, teachers are spending nearly \$600 each year of their own money on supplies for their classroom and students. It's just not right. We can change this.





TEACHER TESTIMONIAL MAIREAD BEANE

Mairead Beane teaches 10th and 11th grade Literature at Minneapolis College Preparatory School, where many of her students would be the first in their families to attend college. Beane's school does not have the resources for a library, so she decided to build a reading center. The mission of the reading center is to expose her students to more books so they can practice reading in a more comfortable and empowering environment.

Creating a reading center filled with fun books may not be the most traditional approach to increasing literacy test scores. But the results are impressive. In one year she saw two years growth from her 10th grade class, bringing her pass rate above the district average!







Our students are raised in homes where drugs, gangs, and violence are normal. Creating a community for them to thrive in inspires me to continue teaching despite the difficulties.
